In our writing lessons, the children will be:

Suggested home reading:




- **Science** In science, we will be looking at **human circulatory system**.

The class will be focussing on generating testable questions to investigate. They will then work on carrying out investigations taking precise measurements and presenting their findings.



**Maths** This term, we will be learning the following:

- 3 weeks on shape
- 2 weeks on statistics
- 1 week on both converting units and position (graphs)



**RE** The class will be looking at the following question: What is the best way for a Christian to show commitment to God?

**Computing** the children working on programming in games using Scratch creating their own programmes by the end.

**MFL** we will be learning about towns and cities, weather and sports and hobbies.

**Music** The children will create music to accompany a short film about a race, composing an extended melody and accompaniment.

Focus piece: 'Theme' from *Chariots of Fire* by Vangelis.

**Art** This project teaches children about significant black artists and their work, and provides opportunities to analyse and create artwork inspired by them.



## Geography

The children will be learning more about reading ordnance survey (OS) maps before moving on to learning more about human geography. They will be covering the following areas: trade, resource management and human settlements.



**PE** Our PE days this term will be on a Monday and Wednesday. The children will be practicing the different events for sports day for the first 3 weeks, followed by learning to play rounders for the final 4 weeks.

**PSHRE** We will be focussing on sexual education. All the children will be learning about how boys and girls bodies develop so that they are prepared for the changes that will happen in their bodies.



**History** This term, the class will learn about Black people in Britain in the 20th century and today. They will about the race relations act, Black people in Britain today and how Black culture has enriched Britain today. They will be creating a biography on a Black person during these sessions as well.
